

1. Suspected Coccidiosis Outbreak in 2019


Mortality in animals • A common, endemic disease Caused significant mortality and 29% lost production Disrupted other management strategies like supplementary creep feeding Highlights 12% • Gaps between farmers & services • Need for better capacity to respond to common problems (farmers and/or support services)

Affected village


2. High mortality outbreaks in 2020

- 40-75% reported having goats and sheep die in last 3 months
- Average mortality 8% in just 3 months equivalent to annual mortality of 30%
- Various causes (diarrhoea, respiratory, sudden death) most diagnoses confirmed
- Economic loss
 - 1,140,000 R total




3. Health issues observed in abattoir animals


- 300 goats submitted to major metropolitan abattoir
- Range of issues
 - Significant proportion affected for some issues
- This suggests problems are widespread and affect:
 - Farmer incomes
 - Food safety
 - Animal welfare



Common themes

- There is a gap between SR farmers & services
 - Farmers don't know who to seek advice/support from
 - Unaware about importance of seeking advice promptly when a disease occurs
 - Availability of prevention and treatments is patchy/inconsistent
- Farmers want more knowledge
- There are examples of good approaches e.g.
 - Farmers purchasing own vaccines to prevent 2 known issues
 - Example of farmer
 - Good connections between e.g. LDs and farmers

Recommendations... Way Forward

- Raise farmer knowledge about
 - how to respond to outbreaks in general i.e., Seek prompt advice
 - More farmer & service provider training on practical treatment and prevention of common diseases
- Try to improve diagnosis of causes of disease to focus treatment and prevention
- Ongoing improved engagement and connections between farmers and service providers – a two-way relationship
