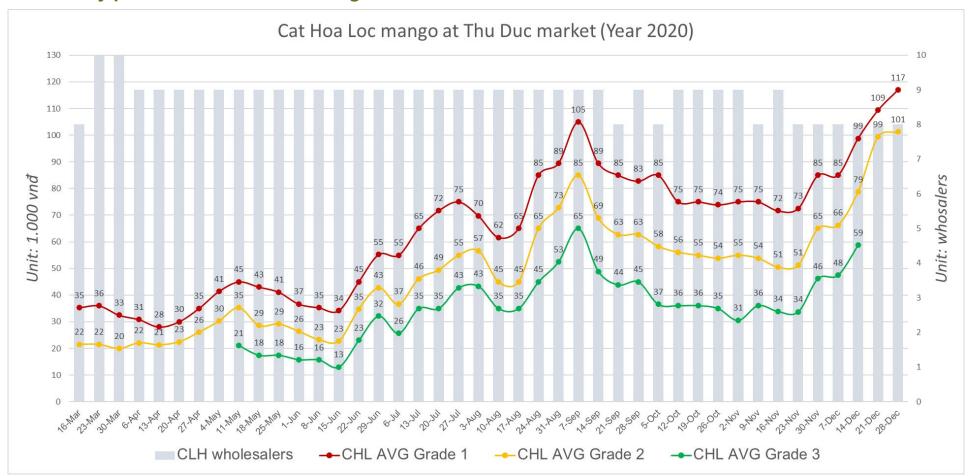


Figure 1. Weekly mango prices of Cat Hoa Loc mango in 2020

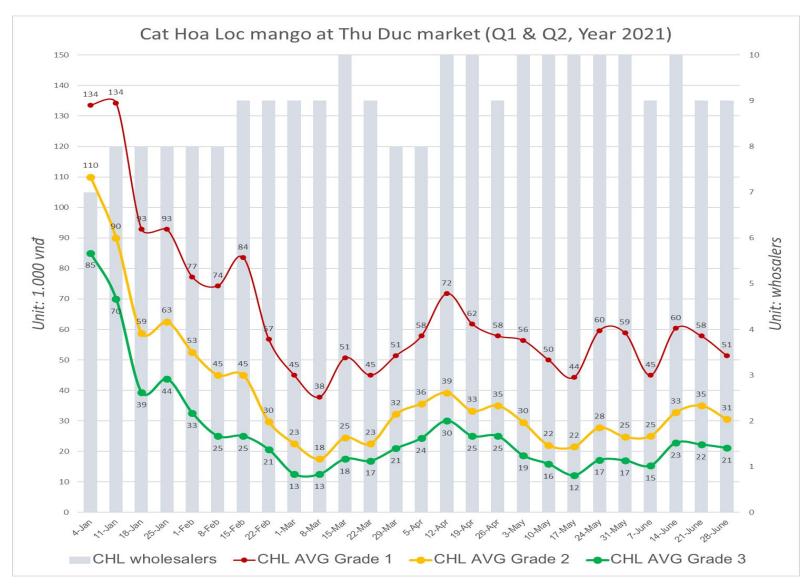


Figure 2. Weekly mango prices of Cat Hoa Loc mango in Q1 and Q2, year 2021

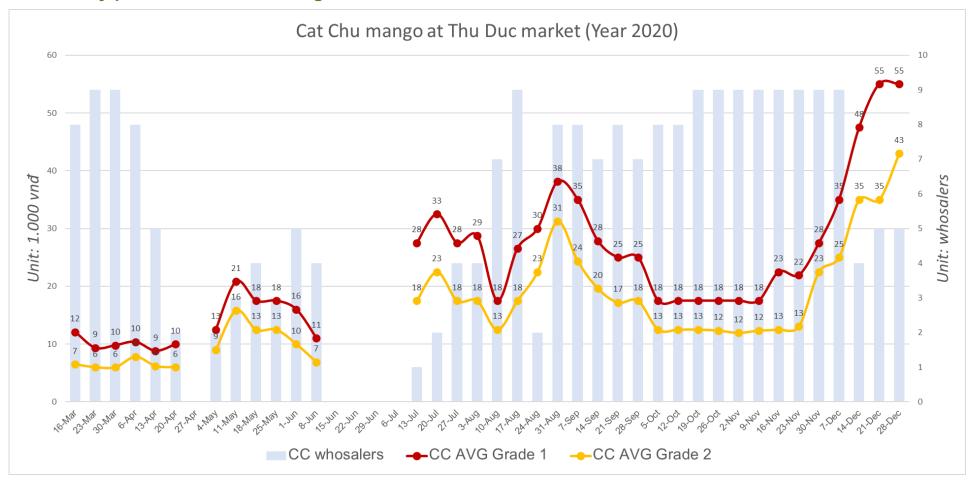


Figure 3. Weekly mango prices of Cat Chu mango in 2020

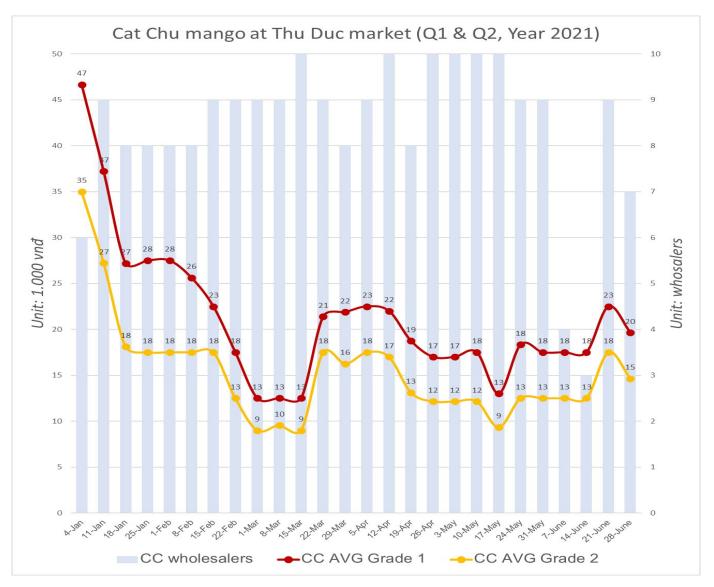


Figure 4. Weekly mango prices of Cat Chu mango in Q1 and Q2, year 2021

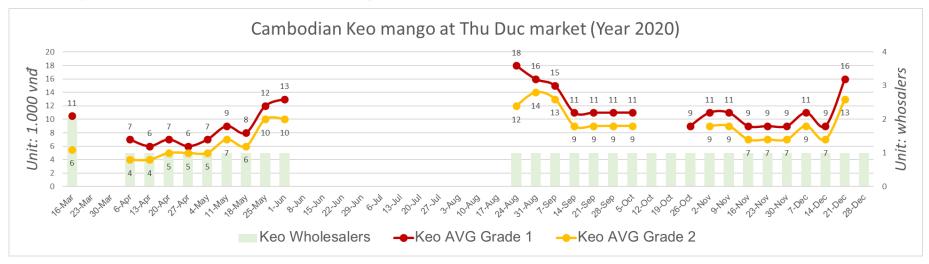


Figure 5. Weekly mango prices of Cambodian Keo mango in 2020

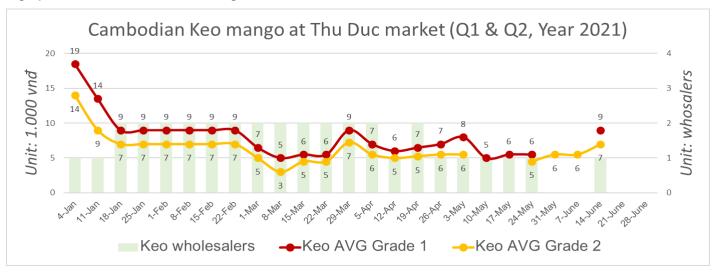


Figure 6. Weekly mango prices of Cambodian Keo mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

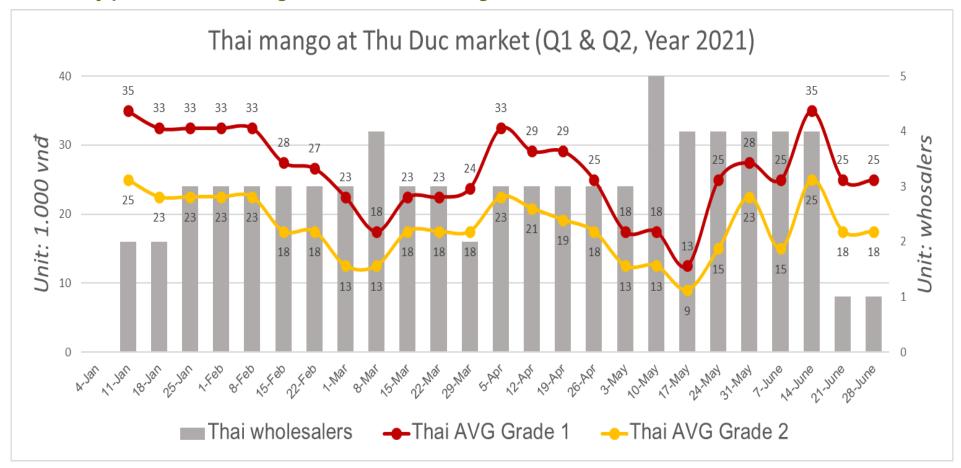


Figure 7. Weekly mango prices of Thai mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

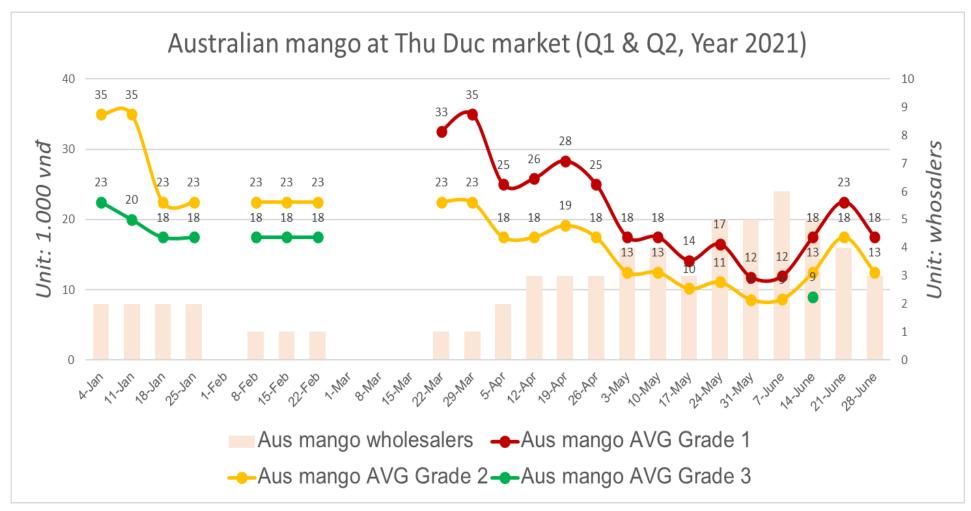


Figure 8. Weekly mango prices of Australian mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

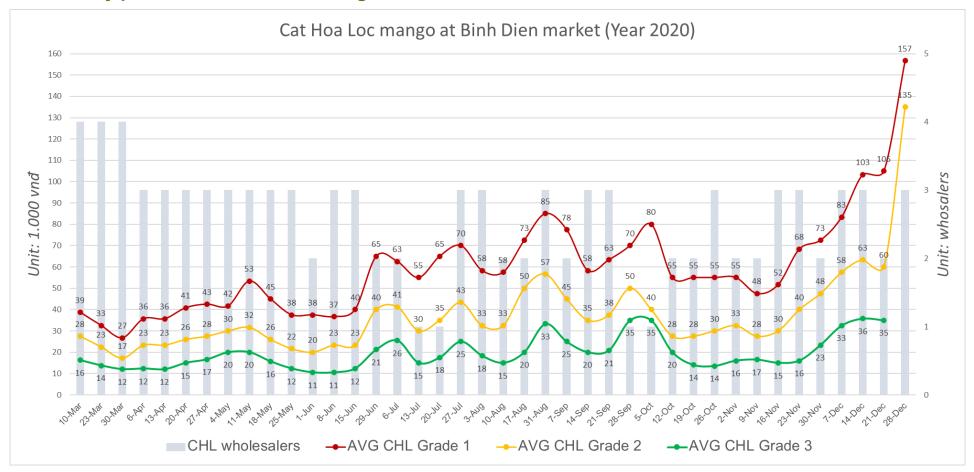


Figure 9. Weekly mango prices of Cat Hoa Loc mango in 2020

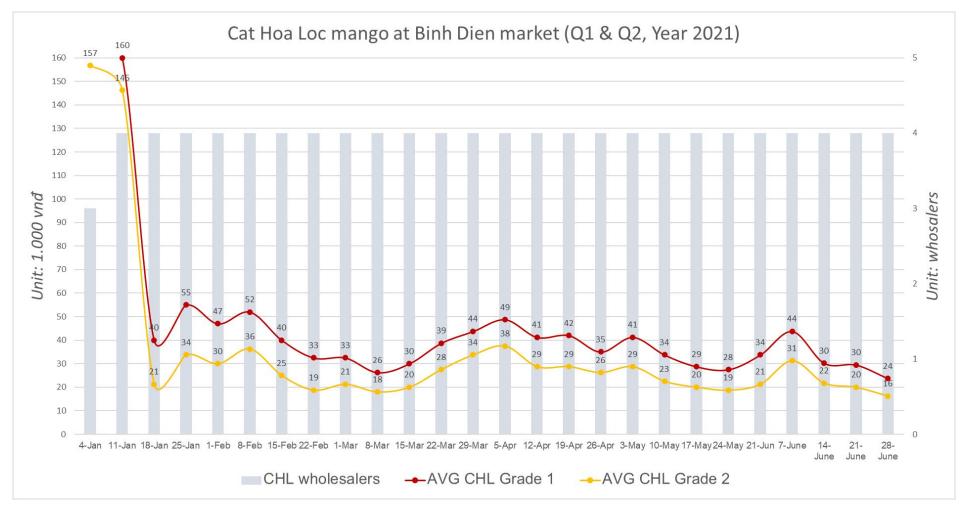


Figure 10. Weekly mango prices of Cat Hoa Loc mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

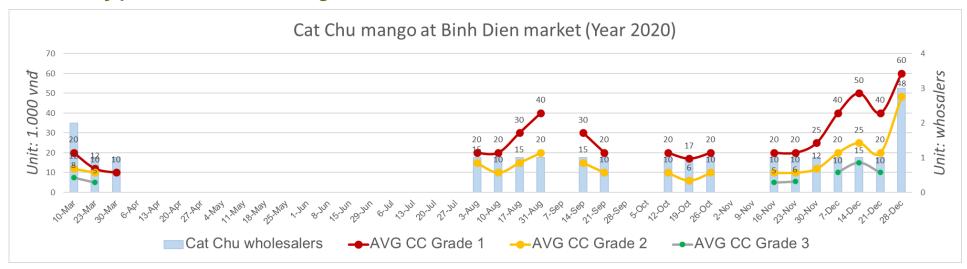


Figure 11. Weekly mango prices of Cat Chu mango in 2020

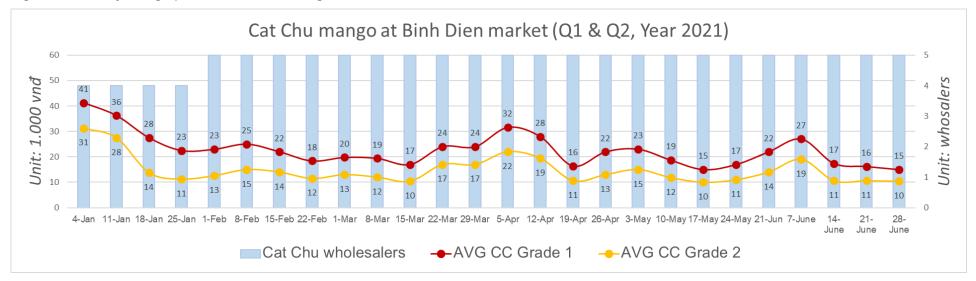


Figure 12. Weekly mango prices of Cat Chu mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

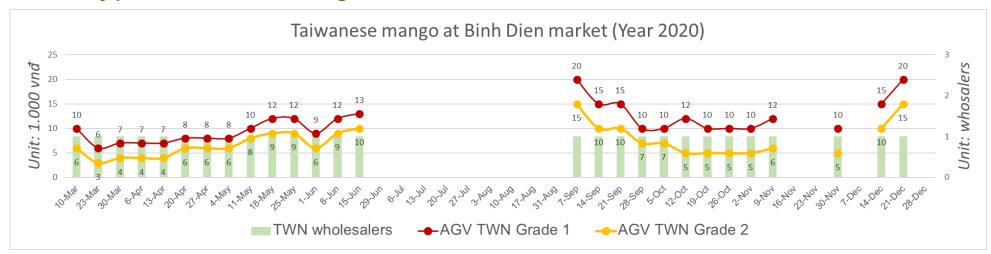


Figure 13. Weekly mango prices of Taiwanese mango in 2020

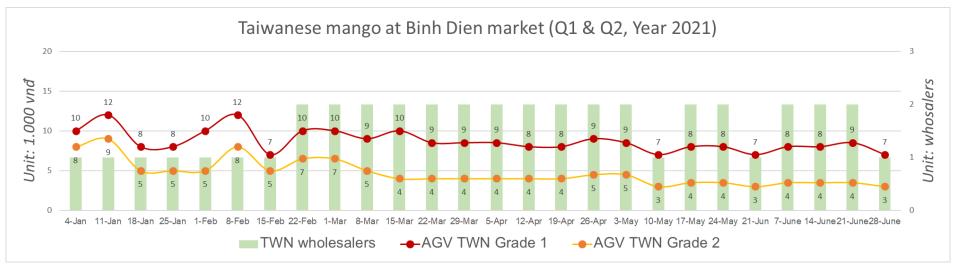


Figure 14. Weekly mango prices of Taiwanese mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

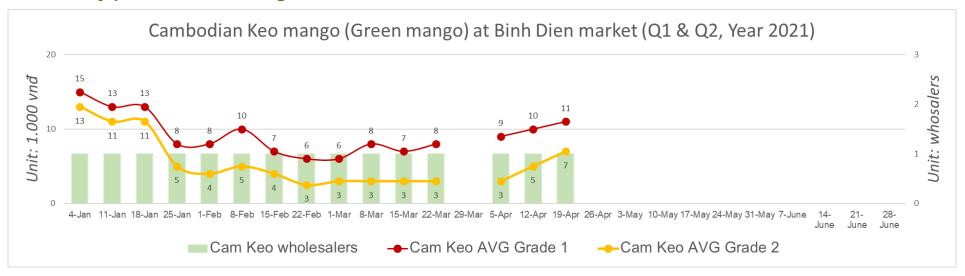


Figure 15. Weekly mango prices of Cambodian Keo mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

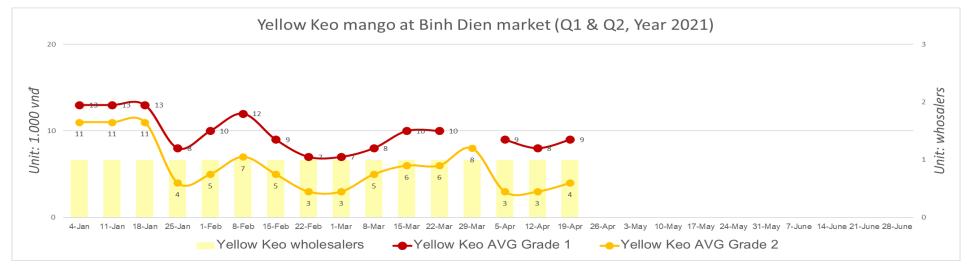


Figure 16. Weekly mango prices of Yellow Keo mango in Q1 & Q2, year 2021

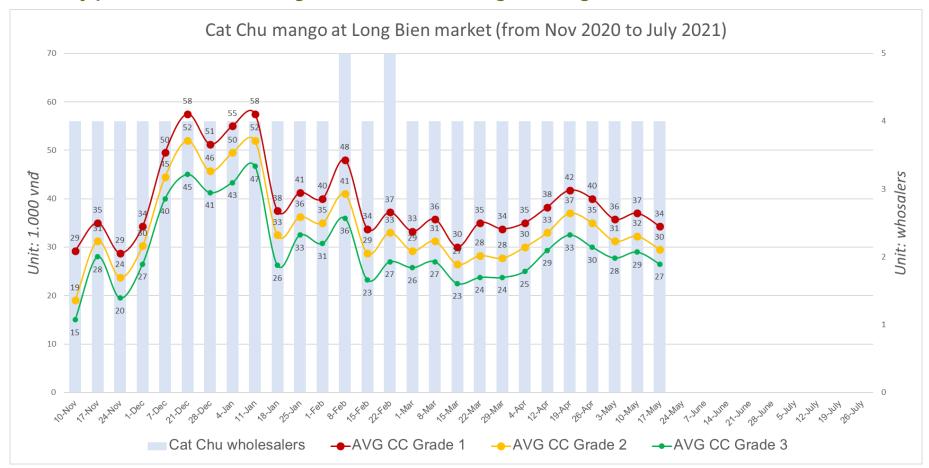


Figure 17. Weekly mango prices of Cat Chu mango at Long Bien market from November 2020 to July 2021

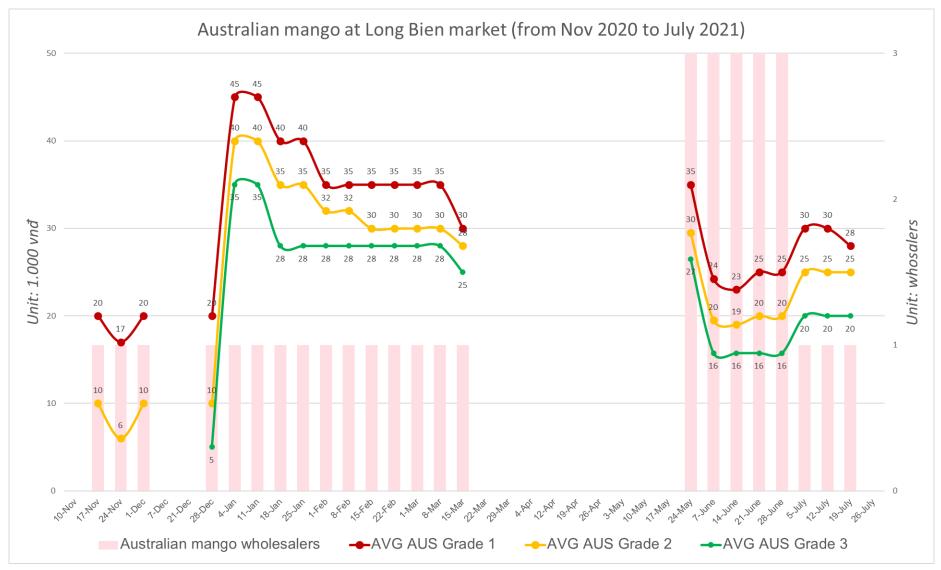


Figure 18. Weekly mango prices of Australian mango at Long Bien market from November 2020 to July 2021

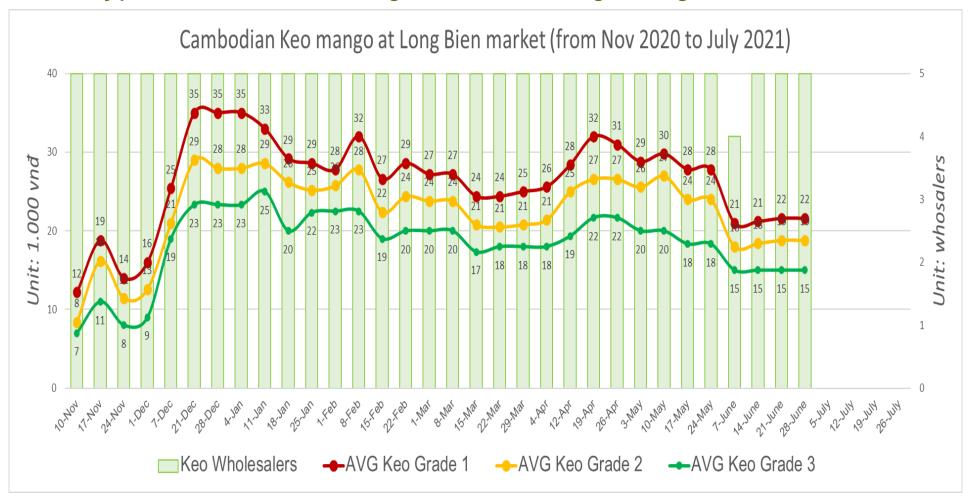


Figure 19. Weekly mango prices of Keo mango at Long Bien market from November 2020 to July 2021

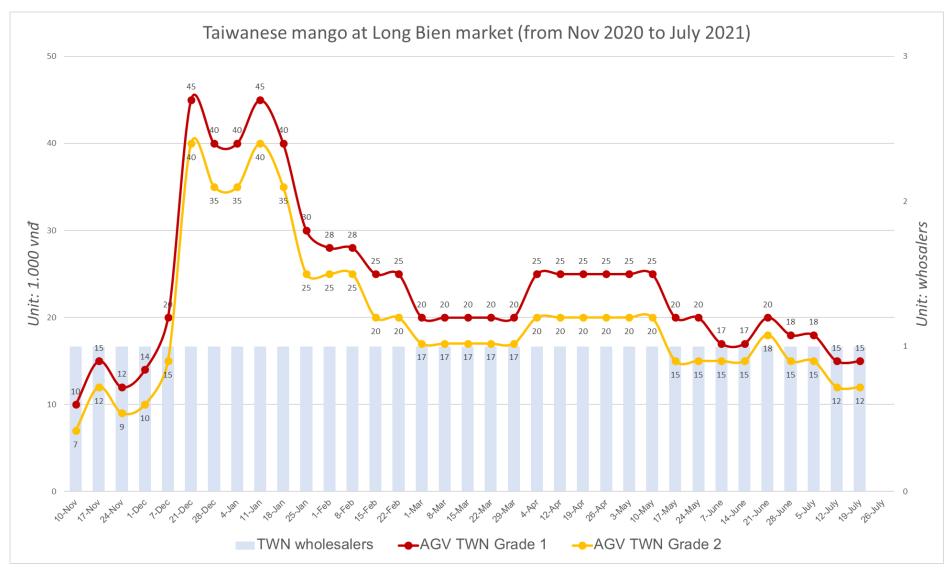


Figure 20. Weekly mango prices of Taiwanese mango at Long Bien market from November 2020 to July 2021
